Dear Parents/Carers,

Getting them used to the importance of appearance and professional dress is vital at this stage. I know that many of you buy new school shoes over summer. Please ensure that they are **standard school shoes**. If you are unsure, ask yourself this simple question: if my son/daughter was a Barrister in a high class Law firm, would these shoes be suitable? Please note – they do not need to be expensive, just professional. A Wyndson's shoe guide is available to view on the school's website; please note that girls can no longer wear boots. Be aware that some shoe shops do tell parents that a particular shoe is a "school shoe" when they are too casual for St. Patrick's. Please use the guide and the question I suggested earlier to help you in these situations.

Finally, in order for your young people to be successful, they need to be here, with us 100% of the time. The teaching at this school is outstanding and we ensure that the very best of the teaching profession are teaching your children. Lessons missed are very hard to catch up on and we know that the pupils with the best attendance have the highest success rates. We understand that there are some occasions when a child cannot attend school, but we are asking you to support your child's education and future success by being strict with your criteria for keeping them home. If they have a cough or a cold, they need to be in school; again, this is important preparation for their professional lives when, in order to be truly successful, they cannot take time off work for minor ailments. We are trying to build resilience into our young people and pushing themselves, especially when they feel under the weather, is important. **Our school trigger for attendance is 97%**; if your child's attendance falls below this or patterns of absence are a cause for concern, we will make contact with you to let you know and to see if we can work together to improve his/her attendance.
