So you want to be a Nurse Consultant...



Julie Flaherty is a Nurse Consultant at Salford Royal Hospital. Julie has worked in Manchester Children's Hospitals for years. She has also worked for the Department of Health and her advice on children's nursing is well respected. She has written lots of books and has had many articles published. She has also spoken at conferences all over the world.

What's the best thing about being a Children's Nurse?

The best thing is helping to make the children better. Seeing their faces through an illness and knowing that you are helping them to get better. Talking with the children, every day they surprise you with the things they say. They are honest and will tell you as it is, they have an amazing amount of courage—far greater than any adult I have ever seen or cared for.

What qualifications do you need to become a Consultant Nurse?

Starting out, you need 'A' levels - at least 2. Then you will need to undertake a degree in Children's Nursing and a Master's Degree in a complimentary subject that will enhance your Children's Nursing skills set, for example, Safe Guarding, Child Protection, Law and Ethics or Management Health Service. You will then need to work towards a PHD in a Children's Nursing related subject and finally at least 15years experience in the children's speciality (mine is Children's A&E)

In YOUR Future...

What would you say to a pupil who wants to be a Children's Nurse?

Question themselves as to why they wanted to be a Children's Nurse. Do they have the affinity, love, hard work and devotion that it takes? If they answer yes to the questions, then expect lots of hard work, dedication and long hours but good fun and a very rewarding career. It takes time! Don't rush, enjoy and think of the good that you can do!

Summer Lemon Cake

INGREDIENTS:

3 Eggs

170 g Self Raising Flour

170 g Caster Sugar

170 g Butter

1 tsp Baking Powder

110g Icing Sugar

2 Lemons

METHOD:



Mix together the eggs, flour, sugar, butter, baking powder and the zest of two lemons. Pop into a tin and bake in the oven (set to 180 degrees Celsius) for 30-45 minutes. Cooking time depends on the size of the loaf and what your oven is like. The best way to test if your cake is cooked is to carefully slide a knife into the centre and if it comes out clean with no cake batter on then the cake is cooked! Whilst the cake is still hot, poke it all over with a skewer then pour on the drizzle. The drizzle is made by mixing together the icing sugar with juice of two lemons.

Book Review: The Fault in Our Stars


