Just 12 days later Katrina flew out to Chicago to begin her treatment at the Northwestern Memorial hospital. Katrina said she was overwhelmed by the generosity of everyone who helped raise the money,



including the staff and pupils at St Patrick's who contributed over £3000 to the fund.

After a gruelling 3 months of treatment, Katrina finally returned home this month to a warm welcome from family and friends. Whilst she is still recovering from the transplant, she is determined to raise awareness of Systemic Sclerosis and is now starting to campaign for stem cell therapy to be offered as a treatment in the UK. Kat says, "I know people say that the stem cell transplant is the worst 3 months of their lives, that they push through it because they know it's worth it, but for me it's been the best! I'm so grateful to have been given this opportunity, thank you to everyone who helped."

### We Are Writers!


Last term all pupils were invited to write a poem, prayer or short story in response to the question, "What does Easter mean to you?
