We have had so many children achieve 100% this term and so many children have made huge improvements since last year. I was talking to two girls who have moved their attendance from 65% to 99.5% yesterday! How amazing that they have made such a turnaround but most importantly, how great they feel the sense of belonging to our school that has kept them getting out of bed every day to join us, rain or shine.

We could not be the school that we are without the support of our parents and carers: thank you for sending your child into school every day, on time and ready to learn - it really does make such a difference that you have those high standards at home too. Thank you also for using Class Charts to keep track of your child's day with us and have those encouraging discussions at home - us all being on the same page is the key to success.




YEAR 9 PRIMARY VISITS

HAVING FUN WITH FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT

We are delighted to say that the new SSAT Embedding Formative Assessment (EFA) programme at St Patrick's has been a tremendous success this term. The feedback from both pupils and staff has been overwhelmingly positive.

Pupils are really enjoying their lessons, with their teachers using engaging strategies such as mini whiteboards, quizzes, polls, think-pair-share, and exit tickets. These innovative methods have not only enhanced student participation but have also deepened their understanding across subjects. It's wonderful to see how much the children are thriving in such an interactive learning environment.

Our staff have found the programme equally rewarding. By beginning to incorporate more of a broad range of formative assessment techniques, teachers are able to gauge student understanding more effectively and tailor their instruction to better meet the needs of our learners. Their enthusiasm for these strategies has further enriched the classroom experience.

We encourage you to ask your child about their learning experiences. Simple questions about their favourite activities can reinforce their enthusiasm and curiosity about what they are studying. It's a great way to keep the conversation about learning going at home.
