

What kind of homework might you have?

- At KS3, all pupils will receive a Knowledge Organiser every half term.
- A Knowledge Organiser contains all the information about a half-termly unit of work which we want all pupils to be able to recall easily.
- When you can remember this knowledge easily, it means you get more out of lessons because you can do more challenging pieces of work.
- Your teachers will set you learning homework from the Knowledge Organiser as well as other tasks, which will likely be skills-based.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights

1. The UDHR was published in 1948.
2. it was a response to the atrocities of World War II.
3. it sets out fundamental rights that should be protected for all humans.
4. There are thirty rights in total. These rights include the right to life, the right to education and the right to an adequate living standard.

Causes of prejudice

1. Ignorance – not understanding others and their experiences
2. Stereotyping – forming an idea of someone based on general appearances
3. Fear – being afraid of difference, especially if there has been a bad experience
4. Upbringing – being taught to be prejudiced
5. Media – being influenced by the way certain groups are portrayed in news, advertisements and television, especially where they are used as scapegoats

What kind of homework might you have?

- At KS4, you might also receive a Knowledge Organiser, to help you learn the content you need to know.
- But you will also have a wider variety of homeworks, depending on the subject and the type of course you are completing.

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Homework

How much homework should you be doing?

- All year groups will get homework in **two** subjects every day.
- As you move up through the year groups, you will be spending longer on homework each evening.
- So, in Year 7, each homework should take you approximately 20-30 minutes.
- By the time you are in Year 11, you should be spending 45-60 minutes on each homework.

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Homework

How should you do homework?

- Set up a homework-friendly area, preferably with a table or desk.
- Schedule a regular homework time.
- Remove distractions, such as phone, TV, loud music.
- Let someone at home know what you need to do so that they can encourage you, check completed homework and quiz you on it.
- Take pride in doing your homework.
