We have had a very busy term, as is always the case at this time of year. When we look back on all the things we have achieved it is hard to believe how we have managed to squeeze it all in!

So many of our pupils have achieved great things both big and small over the course of the last 15 weeks. From Year 7 making such a big move from primary school and settling so well to our Year 11s completing their first set of PPEs (prepublic exams) we have watched with pride as our children grow and learn. You will see many of the great highlights of this term in this newsletter-we hope you enjoy reading about it as much as we've enjoyed being a part of it.

We have put a great deal of energy into talking to pupils and families about the importance of attendance this term. Did you know that if your child has an attendance of 97% to our school or more they have a 93% of passing all their GCSEs? Those with 90% attendance or lower have just a 30% chance of passing! I found this link between how many days your child misses with their success at GCSEs fascinating. We know if they come in to work with us most days in the year their chance of success is excellent. Please continue to keep sending your child in every day. Even if they have stresses or worries we can help and support them. If they are too ill to learn we can always send them home.

This final week of term is a time when we reward pupils for their hard work and dedication. I have enjoyed watching pupils come up to the front in assemblies to be given badges, vouchers, certificates and even invitations to celebration breakfasts and lunches (St Pat's kids love their food (1)). I was especially pleased to see the number of children who have never had a reward before being mentioned for improving and trying their best to turn things around; they are clearly being influenced and inspired by pupils who always do the right thing and that is what being a school family is all about.

We will also be supporting pupils to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas through our advent services on the final day of term. I hope that they take the message away with them that Christmas is not about presents but how Christ came to be the light of the world for us all and how we all have an individual responsibility to share their light with others.

I would like to thank parents for all their support so far this year. The parental support we have is the school's secret ingredient to success and you are a vital part of our team. Every time you turn up to a parents' evening, every time you talk to your child about their homework, every time you tell them to make sure they have their blazer for school helps us to do the very best for your child. 
HOW ST PATRICK'S MARKED ADVENT 2023...

The season of Advent is a very special invitation; an opportunity to sing praises and rejoice in the first coming of the Messiah, but also to prepare for the return of the King. The word Advent comes from the latin "adventus" meaning arrival. Advent therefore invites us to ponder the first coming of Christ and to look forward to his second.

- The Travelling Nativity offered all of Year 7 the chance to focus on the real meaning of Christmas The focus on the Nativity story reminds us of the real nature of Mary and Joseph as Jesus' loving parents.
- During PSHE- week commencing 27th November, there were 2 opportunities to engage with the real meaning of Christmas. Firstly, a detailed examination of all the key elements which made up the journey to Bethlehem and secondly, a reminder of the messages behind the gift of our saviour.
