



# Vaping

Why is there a need to conduct an assembly on vaping?

#### National Context

- Vapes were originally introduced to help adults switch from tobacco-based cigarettes to e-cigarettes
- However, it is now being increasingly used by young people across the country
- Despite being 'better' than tobacco-based cigarettes, there are still many health risks associated with vaping





#### What are the health risks?

- Vapes contain nicotine which is a highly addictive substance
- It has been proven that nicotine can have damaging effects on both adults and young people. It can:
  - Cause an increase in blood
    pressure & heart rate
  - Increase the flow of blood to the heart and narrow arteries
  - Contribute to poor brain development, infections, seizures & lung disease



#### What are the health risks?

- Many people share vapes amongst groups which increases risk of both addiction and infection
- Long term effects of passive vape smoking unknown



#### What are the health risks?

- Short-term effects of vaping include: coughing, headaches, dizziness, sore throats and feeling sick
- Vaping is considered 'safer' than tobacco products but chemicals in vapes are still inhaled and the long term effects on the body are still to be confirmed

#### What does the law say?

- The legal age for vaping is 18 years old
- It is illegal for anybody to be sold any vaping products under 18 years old
- Parents or adults buying for underage children (under 18) can be prosecuted



#### What about at St. Patrick's?

- You are not permitted to bring any vaping products into school
- If staff have reason to suspect you have prohibited items – including vapes – you will be searched
- If you refuse to be searched, you risk permanent exclusion from school and it will be taken further



#### Consequences of vaping in school

- If you are seen vaping or are in possession of a vape in school you will lose your break and lunch for 5 days
- Parents will be contacted
- Repeat offences will warrant more serious sanctions, such as IE and fixed-term suspensions
- If we suspect illegal substances present within vapes, you risk permanent exclusion
- Support to stop vaping will always be offered



# What are we doing to help tackle the rise in vaping?

- Making sure you are informed PSHE, assemblies, information sheets etc.
- Weekly nurse drop-ins for support with giving up vaping
- Additional CCTV and smoke alarms being added in communal toilet areas ensuring a 'vape free zone'
- Communication with parents to work together – parent webinar to be arranged
