What a great start to the academic year we have had! The excellent GCSE results from our Class of 2025 gave us all such a wonderful boost to begin all the hard work again with a new Year 11! We were so thrilled with how last year's Year 11 did. They worked incredibly hard, listened to teachers' expert advice and did it all with a smile (mostly!) on their faces. We were lucky to have such a joyous group of young people to work with.

This year's Year 11 have started with exactly the same attitude. It has been a pleasure to watch them blossom over recent years, under Mr Hindmarch's guidance, and the feedback we have had from the exam invigilators about how mature and focused they have been over their recent exams has been so pleasing, but not one bit surprising. There is a real feeling in the year group of 'I want to do my absolute best', which is all we ever would ask from them.

At the other end of the scale, Year 7 have settled so very well. They are hardworking, kind and already so involved in the wider life of the school. It is lovely to see that they haven't wasted anytime in becoming fully St Patrick's pupils. I felt very proud as we walked them through the Eccles streets to Holy Cross Church a few weeks ago for their Year 7 Welcome Mass-they looked super smart and their Y6 teachers and primary Headteachers couldn't believe how grown up they were!

As you will see from the newsletter, we have been very busy! We couldn't possibly tell you all of the great things that have been going on this half term but a few of my personal highlights of this half term have been:

- Open Morning for Y5/6. The whole school was visited by over 500 children and parents/carers who saw our school during a normal morning. I was so very proud of the children and staff for showing off how we learn and behave every single day. I was also incredibly proud of the prefects who toured visitors around.
- Y7 and 9 retreats. The feedback we have had from the different places we have taken children for spiritual retreats has been amazing. They said we are 'a very special school...' and it was 'a joy' to have us. It is lovely to know our children are proud of being a part of St Patrick's and impress everywhere they go.
- Commissioning mass for pupil chaplains in Years 7-11. We joined together with children from our primaries to commission pupils to carry out a special mission: spreading the good news of Jesus Christ within our schools. It was a special mass and wonderful to have Year 5-11 pupils all standing together to receive a blessing.
- Voices of the Holocaust. Year 10 watched a very powerful and moving play about the holocaust. Their respect and attention was brilliant. They asked searching and sensitive questions at the end of the play. We were so proud of how they responded to one of the most shocking and upsetting periods in history. The company commented on how amazing our pupils are and how they would love to come back to work with us again.

- Feedback from our 5 school bus drivers. I jumped on all 5 of our school buses recently to check pupils are behaving well and being respectful to the drivers and to their fellow pupils as they travel to and from school. The drivers were so positive about our children and said, "they are great," "they are very well behaved", "never any cheeky behaviour", "no messing about", "all the children do is sit and chat (loudly!)". It was great to hear that our pupils can be trusted to do all the right things without staff or parents watching their every move.
- Individual pupil successes. We have so many talented and dedicated pupils who have had great individual success outside of school. It is also great that they have been proud enough to tell us about it. You will find a selection of those stories in our newsletter. - The number of children who improved their attendance from this time last year. It has been a pleasure to see these children in every day but more than this, it is a pleasure to see them looking happier because they are more involved in school life and are doing better in lessons.


Thank you, as always, for your support. You, our parent and carers, understand that your child's happiness and success at school is achieved because we all work together.

ART AND PHOTOGRAPHY WITH ALISON WATERS

Year 11 Art and Design pupils recently had the privilege of working with professional ceramic artist Alison Waters, whose work will soon be exhibited at Manchester City Gallery. This exciting opportunity allowed students to connect their classroom studies with the wider world of contemporary art, gaining invaluable insight into the life and practice of a professional artist.

Prior to Alison's visit, pupils explored her artistic journey through research pages, investigating the wide-ranging experiences that shaped her career before she became a ceramicist. This foundation prepared them to truly appreciate seeing her work first-hand and learning directly from her about the importance of perseverance, adaptability, and creativity. Alison's story highlighted to pupils that an artist's journey is rarely linear, but one of discovery, resilience, and growth.

Inspired by her distinctive ceramic chimney pots, students set about designing and creating their own ceramic forms. Once fired, these pieces will become canvases for their own photography, merging two creative disciplines into one artwork. This not only developed pupils' technical skills in clay but also their ability to express ideas through mixed media.

For pupils, experiencing Alison's ceramics in person and engaging in conversation with her brought art alive in a way that textbooks alone cannot achieve. The workshop inspired them to see creative pathways as not only possible but rewarding, echoing the Catholic principle of helping each individual grow in wisdom, creativity, and faith.







COLUMBAN PILGRIMAGE

Pupil Chaplains visited Holy Cross to meet Columban missionaries, who were stopping for lunch during their pilgrimage walk. They discussed the impact of climate change around the world, and prayed for the future of our common home.




IN OTHER NEWS...



HUBERT RANKED NO.1 IN THE UK FOR UNDER-13 DISCUS! "

This summer, during the Salford Schools Athletics Meeting, Hubert K caught the eye of coaches from Salford Metropolitan Athletic Club. Following conversations with his parents, Hubert joined the club to develop his skills in Shot Put and Discus, and he's been making remarkable progress ever since.

When he began his throwing journey, Hubert was already achieving excellent distances - over 8 metres in the Shot Put and around 20 metres in the Discus. Since then, his hard work has paid off. Competing for Salford Mets in the England Athletics Youth Development League, Hubert finished the season with outstanding results: a Shot Put best of 10.85m, ranking him 5th in the UK, and a Discus throw of 34.13m, which not only broke a long-standing meeting record but also secured him the title of No.1 Under-13 discus thrower in the UK.
